DECISION IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING

LEVITZ REGISTRATION STATEMENT SUSPENDED. The SEC has issued a stop order suspending the effectiveness of a registration statement filed by Levitz Furniture Corp., of Pottstown, Pa., covering a proposed offering of 600,000 shares of common stock. The Commission's action was based on an offer of settlement submitted by the company in which it waived a hearing, admitted allegations of fact by the Commission's staff, and consented to the immediate issuance if a stop order and to the issuance in due course of an opinion containing findings of fact and conclusions of fact or law, but without admitting or denying such conclusions.

The Commission's staff alleged that the registration statement, in discussing the company's employee relations, was misleading or incomplete in failing to disclose, among other things, the facts that certain executives of Levitz had been informed by the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (IBT) that a nationwide campaign to organize the employees of the company would begin on or about June 1, 1972; that a Levitz executive had indicated to IBT that the company would not oppose IBT's campaign if deferred until completion of the proposed offering; and that IBT agreed to defer such campaign to on or about July 1, 1972. It was further alleged that the registration statement was deficient in failing to disclose what effects, if any, a nationwide campaign to organize the company's employees would have on its business operations, relations with its employees, and income from operations. REGULATION A EXEMPTIONS OF DYNAMIC MARKETING INDUSTRIES AND POTPOURRI INTERNATIONAL PERMANENTLY SUSPENDED. The Commission has made permanent a prior order temporarily suspending Regulation A exemptions from registration with respect to public offerings of 125,000 shares of common stock of Dynamic Marketing Industries Corp. of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania at \$2.40 per share and 300,000 shares of common stock of Potpourri International, Inc. also of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania at \$1.00 per share.

The temporary suspension order had alleged, among other things, that the notifications and offering circulars contained misleading and untrue statements of facts with respect to common control of the issuers and the relationship of Dynamic to the underwriter and failed to disclose that the issuers were both subject to the control of a named third party, and that a Regulation A exemption was not available because the aggregate of the two offerings exceeded \$300,000.

Hearings had been requested by both issuers and by the named underwriter. Subsequently, all three, without admitting or denying the allegations, withdrew their requests and the temporary suspensions were ordered permanent. (Rel. 33-5264)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENT

ENVIRONMENTAL DEVICES, INC. REGULATION A EXEMPTION SUSPENDED. The SEC has issued an order temporarily suspending a Regulation A exemption from registration under the Securities Act of 1933 with respect to a public offering of stock by Environmental Devices, Inc. of Berkeley, California. The order provides an opportunity for hearing upon request, on the question whether the suspension should be vacated or made permanent.

Pursuant to a notification filed on June 25, 1971, Environmental Devices offered 100,000 shares of its stock at \$5.00 per share. According to the order, the Commission has reason to believe that: (a) the terms and conditions of Regulation A have not been complied with in that the ceiling limitation of \$500,000 was exceeded; (b) the notification and offering circular omit to state facts necessary to make the statements made not misleading, particularly with respect to the fact that the offering of shares would be contingent upon compulsory purchases in the after market; and (c) the offering was made in violation of Section 17 of the Securities Act of 1933.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

STANDARD LAND TITLE & TRUST, R. F. WILLIAMS ENJOINED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced that on June 19, 1972 the Federal Court in Lincoln, Nebraska permanently enjoined Standard Land Title and Trust Agency and Robert F. Williams, both of Phoenix, Arizona, from aiding and abetting other persons or entities in violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws in the offer and sale of notes, evidences of indebtedness, guarantees thereof, investment contracts entitled first mortgages, or any other security of any issuer. The defendants consented to the Court order. (LR-5445)

WALLA WALLA BUSINESS COLLEGE, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC Seattle Regional Office announced June 21 that the Federal court for the Eastern District of Washington preliminarily enjoined Walla Walla Business College, Inc., Raymond Whittle, president and a director, Roger L. Corn, secretary-treasurer and a director, Dean Corn, a former president and director and Norman Fronk, all of Walla Walla, Washington, from further violations of registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws. The alleged violations of the Federal securities acts occurred in connection with the offer and sale of common stock and debentures of Walla Walla Business College, a small business training school. MARY LOU ENGELHART SENTENCED. The SEC Atlanta Regional Office announced that a Superior Court in Fulton County, Georgia sentenced Mary Lou Engelhart to one year imprisonment on each of three convictions of larceny of securities from a securities firm. (LR-5446)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BROCKTON EDISON COMPANY. The SEC has issued an order authorizing Brockton Edison Company, Brockton, Massachusetts, subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates ("EUA"), to issue and sell \$8 million of first mortgage and collateral trust bonds, due 2002, at competitive bidding. Net proceeds will be used to repay advances on open account from EUA and short-term bank notes incurred to finance the company's construction program. (Rel. 35-17624)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC. The SEC has issued an order authorizing American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to act as surety for one of its electric utility subsidiary companies, Wheeling Electric Company, in connection with Wheeling's placing new rates into effect. The Trust will primarily invest in land to be leased back to developers, as well as building and permanent mortgages. Sonnenblick-Goldman Corp. is investment adviser. (File 2-44728)
