EXTENSION OF COMMENT PERIOD ON PROPOSED NEW REGISTRATION FORMS FOR INSURANCE COMPANY SEPARATE ACCOUNTS

The Commission is extending until May 15, 1984 the date by which comments must be submitted on proposed new registration Forms N-3 and N-4 for insurance company separate accounts offering variable annuity contracts. The Commission published and requested written comments on the proposal in Investment Company Act Release No. 13689 (December 22, 1983).

Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, DC 20549. Comments must be received on or before May 15 and should refer to File No. S7-1007. All submissions will be available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Reference Room. (Rel. IC-13800)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

KOENIG TAX-ADVANTAGED LIQUIDITY FUND, INC.

An order has been issued exempting Koenig Tax-Advantaged Liquidity Fund, Inc. from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Investment Company Act. This will permit Koenig to base its sales load applicable to additional investments by any investor on that investor's cumulative investment in Koenig including reinvested distributions, if any, but without regard to redemptions of the investor's shares. ALPHA CASH MANAGEMENT FUND, INC.

ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY
