ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ALAN BENNETT HARP CITED

Administrative Law Judge Ralph Hunter Tracy filed an initial decision ordering that Alan Bennett Harp be barred from association with any broker or dealer.

Judge Tracy found that Harp, a registered representative in the Houston, Texas office of Mabon, Nugent & Co., wilfully violated the manipulative and antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in the purchase of large blocks of stocks on the New York Stock Exchange on behalf of a customer.

INVESTMENT ADVISER REGISTRATION OF JESSE ROSENBLUM d/b/a HARBINE FINANCIAL SERVICE SUSPENDED FOR SIX MONTHS; ROSENBLUM SUSPENDED FOR SAME PERIOD

The Commission suspended the investment adviser registration of Jesse Rosenblum, doing business as Harbine Financial Service, of Closter, New Jersey, for six months. It also suspended Rosenblum from association with any investment adviser for the same period. The suspensions are effective June 11, 1984.

The Commission found that Rosenblum's advertising brochures were fraudulent in that they did not disclose a 1980 injunction entered against Rosenblum, downplayed the risks of having Rosenblum manage clients' funds, and made it appear that Harbine was more than it really was -- a part-time operation. The Commission also found that Rosenblum failed to amend his registration application to report the injunction, and failed to amend his application promptly to disclose the entry of a New Jersey cease and desist order. DAVID A. FELDMAN DEFAULTED

The Commission barred David A. Feldman from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser, investment company or affiliate thereof. This sanction was imposed after Feldman failed to file an Answer to the Order for Proceedings.

The Order for Proceedings, upon which the sanction is based, alleged that Feldman wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by: concealing his interest in two partnership accounts established at a registered broker-dealer; and preparing bogus bank guarantee letters which he presented to the registered broker-dealer and which he persuaded the broker-dealer to accept for the purpose of meeting the collateral requirements in the accounts referred to above. In addition, Feldman, on February 22, 1983, under a jury trial, was convicted by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, of 19 counts of mail fraud and nine counts of wire fraud [U.S. v. David A. Feldman, 81 CR 696]. (Rel. 34-20969)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JETFILM CORPORATION ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on May 11 Judge Paul A. Magnuson, U.S. District Court for the District of Minnesota, entered an Order to Show Cause Why JetFilm Corporation and Marvin E. Wallis Should Not Be Held in Civil Contempt of an injunction entered against them by the same court on September 13, 1982, enjoining them from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Order to Show Cause directed JetFilm and Wallis to appear for a hearing on May 21 to show cause why they should not be adjudged in civil contempt.

The Commission's application for an order to show cause, filed May 11, alleged that since the court's September 13, 1982 permanent injunction, the defendants have engaged in two unregistered offerings of JetFilm securities using fraudulent offering documents. Among other things, the Commission alleges that the offering documents misrepresent JetFilm's financial condition and sales history, fail to adequately disclose the 1982 injunctions, and fail to disclose that JetFilm has no employees and no manufacturing facilities. (SEC v. JetFilm Corporation and Marvin E. Wallis, D. Minn., Civil Action No. 3-82-319). (LR-10397)

**UTAH FEDERAL COURT ENJOINS DAYSTAR LTD.
AND VALHALLA LTD.**

The Commission announced that on May 22 Chief Judge Aldon J. Anderson, U.S. District Court for the District of Utah, granted the Commission's Motion for Default Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Daystar (West Indies) Ltd., also known as Daystar Ltd., and Valhalla Ltd., companies incorporated in Anguilla, British West Indies. Judge Anderson found that Daystar and Valhalla violated and aided and abetted violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and enjoined them from violations of such provisions.

The complaint alleged that Daystar and Valhalla offered and sold unregistered securities in the form of investment contracts called "Deeds of Settlement" to at least 200 investors in seven states with investments totalling at least \$1 million. The complaint alleged misrepresentations concerning the return of investors money and concerning the returns that investors could expect to receive.

Judge Anderson ordered that Daystar and Valhalla must file within 20 days of the service of the Court order an accounting of all funds relating to Daystar and its investors, and must disgorge and make restitution of investors funds and any profits from such funds. They were also ordered not to dissipate or dispose of assets from such investments. (SEC v. Daystar (West Indies) Ltd., et al., USDC UT, Central Division, Civil Action No. C-83-0400-A). (LR-10401)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MERRILL LYNCH INSTITUTIONAL FUND, INC.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Merrill Lynch Institutional Fund, Inc., Merrill Lynch Government Fund, Inc. and Merrill Lynch Institutional Tax Exempt Fund (Funds), open-end, diversified investment companies, declaring that Charles C. Cabot, Jr., a director of the Funds, shall not be deemed an interested person, the investment adviser or principal underwriter for the Funds as defined in Section 2(a)(19) of the Investment Company Act. LLOYDS BANK INTERNATIONAL CANADA

An order has been issued exempting Lloyds Bank International Canada, subsidiary of Lloyds Bank International Limited, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-13963 - May 24)

FEDERATED EQUITY TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 19 to request a hearing on applications by Federated Equity Trust, Federated Money Market Trust, and Federated Bond Trust, all registered open-end, diversified, management investment companies, requesting orders declaring that they have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-13964 - May 25)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 20 to request a hearing on a proposal by Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries regarding the issuance and sale of short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to a dealer in commercial paper and capital contributions and open account advances to the subsidiaries. (Rel. 35-23312 - May 24)

CENTRAL OHIO COAL COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing four subsidiaries of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to lease coal mining equipment with an aggregate acquisition cost not exceeding \$35 million from a nonaffiliate company. (Rel. 35-23313 - May 25)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-19) to extend the pilot program testing the operation of enhancements to the Automated Bond System from April 30 to June 30, 1984. (Rel. 34-20992)

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Rule changes filed by the following have become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934: Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company (SR-PSDTC-84-5) revising PSDTC's current fees for certain major services so that the fees more accurately reflect PSDTC's cost. The revised fee schedule increases fees for a number of existing services including: secondary depository accounts, odd-lot withdrawals and additions and deletions of names under the signature card distribution program. The rule change also includes new fees for tape output and data transmission, invalid dividend claims, transfer status requests, document preparation, signature and maintenance and participant training. In addition, to encourage more automated processing, PSDTC has reduced its fees for automated transfers and increased its fees for manually executed transfers. (Rel. 34-20993); and the Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-84-6) expanding OCC's Options Pledge Program to allow members to pledge their long market-maker and specialist options positions to more than one pledgee, as collateral for loans. (Rel. 34-20994)
