CHANGE IN COMMISSION MEETING OF NOVEMBER 9

The following additional item will be considered at an open meeting scheduled for Tuesday, November 9, 1982, at 9:00 a.m.:

Consideration of whether to adopt Rule 10b-18 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. If adopted, the rule would provide that an issuer and certain related persons would not incur liability under the anti-manipulative provisions of the Exchange Act in connection with purchases of the issuer's common stock if such purchases were made in compliance with the conditions of Rule 10b-18. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CNG PRODUCING COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by CNG Producing Company (Producing Company), a wholly-owned, non-utility subsidiary of Consolidated Natural Gas Company, to transfer its interest in an oil pipeline to a wholly-owned subsidiary, CNG Pipeline Company, in exchange for common stock and long-term negotiable notes. NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, to acquire the publicly owned, non-affiliated Manchester Electric Company (Manchester). The acquisition would be accomplished by an exchange of common stock at a ratio of 2.5 shares of NEES for each share of Manchester, provided at least 80 percent of the outstanding Manchester stock is deposited by Manchester stockholders in response to the exchange offer. Thereafter, NEES will develop a program for the effective integration of Manchester into the NEES system. (Rel. 35-22699 - Nov. 8)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER SERVICE CORPORATION

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (CBOE) has filed an amendment to a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-82-11) to provide for: (i) a stock index option exercise limit representing an aggregate stock index option contract value of \$300 million; (ii) a daily report for positions of 200 or more stock index option contracts; and (iii) index computation and dissemination in one-minute intervals.
