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## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

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### CITICORP

The application declares that the trusteeship of The United States Trust Company of New York under four existing indentures and a pooling and servicing agreement dated January 1, 1986, under which certificates evidencing interests in a pool of mortgage loans have been issued, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Trust Company from acting as trustee. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
