ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST BRIAN H. McMAHON

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Brian H. McMahon, doing business as Columbia Transfer Company, a registered transfer agent located in Bethpage, New York.

The Order Instituting Proceedings alleges that during various periods from about July 1, 1983 to about February 28, 1985, Registrant violated the recordkeeping, fingerprinting and lost and stolen securities program and the safeguarding of securities and funds provisions of the Exchange Act in that it failed to: (1) give prompt and diligent attention to processing non-routine items; (2) respond timely to written inquiries and requests; (3) comply with various recordkeeping requirements; (4) maintain current and accurate master securityholder files and control books; (5) safeguard funds and securities; (6) file an annual study and evaluation of internal accounting control; (7) register in the lost and stolen securities program; and (8) fingerprint various employees.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Registrant are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action is appropriate. (Rel. 34-23176)

PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST STEPHEN S. YORK WORLD WIDE INVESTMENTS, INC. AND STEPHEN S. YORK

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Stephen S. York World Wide Investments, Inc. (Registrant), a registered Denver, Colorado broker-dealer, and its president, Stephen S. York (York).

The Order for Public Proceedings alleges, among other things, that Registrant wilfully violated, and York wilfully aided and abetted violations of, the net capital rule, customer protection provisions, telegraphic notice provisions, and access to books and records provisions of the securities laws.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Registrant and York are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action is appropriate. (Rel. 34-23183)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

IDS LIFE OF NEW YORK ACCOUNTS 1, 2 AND 3

An order has been issued declaring that IDS Life of New York Accounts 1, 2 and 3 has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-15084 - May 2)

FIRST BOSTON ASSET MANAGEMENT CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 21 to request a hearing on an application filed by First Boston Asset Management Corporation and The First Boston Corporation for an order exempting them from the provisions of Section 9(a) of the Investment Company Act. The Commission also issued an order of temporary exemption pending a final determination by the Commission on the application. (Rel. IC-15086 - May 5)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AEP GENERATING COMPANY; NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until May 27 to request a hearing on an application filed under the same release by: AEP Generating Company - subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to borrow up to \$150 million, in any combination, under a fixed rate term loan agreement or one or more interest rate swap agreements respecting the same principal amount; General Public Utilities Corporation - a registered holding company, to guarantee the performance of office lease obligations by its subsidiary, GPU Nuclear Corporation; Allegheny Generating Company - subsidiary of Allegheny Power System, Inc., to issue and sell up to \$200 million of debentures as the initial step in providing permanent financing of its 40% interest in the Bath County (Virginia) Pumped Storage Project; and Ohio Power Company - subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., and its coal-mining subsidiaries, for these subsidiaries to lease mining equipment with an aggregate acquisition cost not exceeding \$16.5 million from a nonassociate company and for Ohio Power to guarantee the payments of one of these subsidiaries. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
