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### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FORM D

The Commission is publishing for public comment proposed amendments to Form D, the filing required whenever an exemption from the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 under Regulation D is utilized. The proposals are designed to make Form D a uniform notification so that it can be used at both the federal and state levels. Other proposed revisions would change or eliminate certain item requirements of the Form and delete the six month updating provision. Comment is also sought about the appropriateness of eliminating the final filing requirement of the Form D upon completion of the offering.

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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### CHRISTOPHER BROWN NAMED REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR OF FORT WORTH REGIONAL OFFICE

Chairman Shad announced the appointment of Christopher Brown as the Regional Administrator of the Commission's Fort Worth Regional Office. Mr. Brown joined the SEC in 1978 as an Assistant Chief Trial Attorney in its Division of Enforcement in Washington, DC. In 1980, he was selected as the Assistant Regional Administrator for Enforcement in the Fort Worth Regional Office. For the past two years, he has served as the Assistant Regional Administrator for Regulation in that office. Prior to joining the SEC, Mr. Brown was a member of the staff of the Civil Aeronautics Board in Washington, DC where he served in various positions of responsibility including Chief of the Legal Division in the Bureau of Enforcement. Mr. Brown received his B.A. degree from Georgetown University in 1965 and a J.D. degree from the New York University School of Law in 1968.

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### M-ZERO CORPORATION STOP ORDER FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge suspending the effectiveness of a registration statement filed under the Securities Act of 1933 by M-Zero Corporation, of Vienna, Virginia, has become final. The statement covers a proposed public offering of 5,000,000 shares of M-Zero's common stock at a penny a share.

According to the law judge's decision, M-Zero failed to cooperate in the Commission's investigation. Despite repeated demands, M-Zero did not produce requested documents and records and its president refused to testify under oath. (Rel. 33-6646)

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### LANDIS SECURITIES CORPORATION, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that on June 3 the federal court in Alexandria, Virginia enjoined Landis Securities Corporation and Philip S. Landis, both of Reston, Virginia, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Landis Petroleum Corporation was enjoined from aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud provisions. All defendants consented to being

enjoined without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, which alleged that five unregistered oil and gas limited partnership offerings, raising a total of approximately \$3.6 million, were sold to over 100 investors during 1981-84. The complaint also alleged that approximately \$1 million of investors' monies, from three of the offerings, were misappropriated by the defendants. (SEC v. Landis Securities Corporation, et al., USDC EDVA, Civil Action No. 86-0623-A). (LR-11119)

#### COMPLAINTS NAME AUTOMATIX INCORPORATED AND JOHN DIAS

The Commission today filed Complaints for Permanent Injunction and Other Relief in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Automatix Incorporated, with its principal place of business in Massachusetts, and John Dias, its chief financial officer. The complaint against Automatix alleges violations of the reporting, books and records, and internal controls provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 Without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, Automatix consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Order under which it is permanently enjoined from violating certain provisions of the federal securities laws and is ordered to comply with an undertaking designed to prevent future violations. The complaint against Dias alleges violations of the antifraud, bookkeeping, books and records, and internal control provisions of the Exchange Act as well as the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act. (SEC v. Automatix Incorporated, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-1596; SEC v. John Dias, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-1597). (LR-11121)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### THE QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 25 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Queensland Government Development Authority for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15129 - June 4)

#### MITSUBISHI BANK (PANAMA) S.A.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mitsubishi Bank (Panama) S.A. for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act so that it may offer U.S. dollar-denominated certificates of deposit and other debt securities in the United States. #### INTERNATIONAL INVESTORS INCORPORATED

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 25 to request a hearing on an application filed by International Investors Incorporated, Van Eck Funds and Van Eck Securities Corporation for an order approving certain offers of exchange on a basis other than relative net asset value. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued regarding a proposal by Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to issue and sell preferred stock during 1986 by competitive bidding.

The supplemental order corrects the amount of preferred stock CPL is authorized to issue and sell from 400,000 shares to 450,000 shares. (Rel. 35-24116 - May 30)

#### MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued releasing jurisdiction over and approving the underwriting fees and the terms and conditions associated with the previously authorized issuance and sale by Middle South Energy, Inc., subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., of up to \$300 million of its first mortgage bonds by negotiated public offering or private placement. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
