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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### PROPOSED RULES AND AMENDMENTS AFFECTING ADVERTISING BY INVESTMENT COMPANIES

The Commission is proposing for public comment new rules and rule and form amendments under the Securities Act of 1933 and Investment Company Act of 1940 which would: (a) standardize the computation of investment company performance data in advertisements and sales literature; (b) require that certain risk disclosures accompany performance data in advertisements; (c) improve prospectus disclosure regarding performance data; and (d) eliminate the requirement to file investment company sales material with the Commission if it is filed with the National Association of Securities Dealers.

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST RAYMOND O. ROSE

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Raymond O. Rose of Westport, Connecticut, based upon violations of the antifraud and credit extension provisions of the securities laws and a permanent injunction from further violation of these provisions.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that Rose, president of Oliver Rose Securities, Inc., a broker-dealer registered with the Commission and now in bankruptcy, misrepresented to investors the net asset value of their limited partnership interests, attempted to manipulate the market for an OTC security, and participated in illegal extensions of credit. The Order further alleges that on April 22, Rose was enjoined from further violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act, Sections 7(c), 7(f) and 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5, and Regulation T and X of the Federal Reserve Board. 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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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### **RICHARD W. SUTER HELD IN CIVIL CONTEMPT**

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on September 9 Richard W. Suter was held in Civil Contempt by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois for violating the terms of a Temporary Restraining Order, and Orders of Preliminary and Permanent Injunction entered against him, which had enjoined him from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws. The Court found that Suter, in contempt of the Court Order, had sold securities without disclosing his identity; the existence of prior administrative orders, civil injunctions, and a criminal conviction; the financial condition of the issuer; the risk of the investment; and the use of proceeds. The Court also found Suter in contempt for failing to provide an accounting, for dissipating funds, and for failure to maintain certain records.

The Court ordered Suter to deposit with the Clerk of the Court an amount equal to the funds raised from investors; to provide a full accounting of the money raised; to produce certain records; to inform all investors of the contempt proceedings; and to pay the Commission's attorneys' fees. The Court also ordered that unless Suter complies with these terms by October 9, he will be imprisoned until he complies or proves compliance impossible. (SEC v. Richard W. Suter, et al., 85 C 4842, NDIL). (LR-11218)

### **CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST W. CARL ZIMMERMAN AND HUGH F. SACKETT**

The Los Angeles Regional Office filed a civil injunctive action on September 3 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California against W. Carl Zimmerman and Hugh F. Sackett alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint alleges that from 1979 through at least March 1984, Zimmerman, and from at least July 1982 through at least March 1984, Sackett, directed and controlled, through American Principals Holdings, Inc. (APHI) and its predecessors and subsidiaries, the offer and sale of unregistered securities in the form of interests and debentures in at least 70 limited partnerships and raised in excess of \$90 million from at least 2,500 investors. The complaint further alleged that Zimmerman and Sackett caused material misstatements and omissions to be made in connection with the offer and sale of securities by APHI concerning, among other things, the actual use of approximately \$10 million of investors' funds, the use of new investors' funds to carry existing partnerships and to pay expenses for unrelated partnerships, and the commingling of investors' funds among partnerships. (SEC v. W. Carl Zimmerman and Hugh F. Sackett, USDC SDCA, Civil Action No. 86-1846E, cm). (LR-11219)

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## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **MARK PENNINK**

An order has been issued declaring that Mark Pennink, Alan Pitcarin and Natalie Clara Pitcairn are not "interested persons" of Pitcairn Group, L.P., as defined in Section 2(a)(19) of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15305 - Sept. 12)

### **OPC SCHERER FUNDING CORPORATION**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 6 to request a hearing on an application by OPC Scherer Funding Corporation for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act to permit it to issue debt securities for the purpose of financing and refinancing an electric generating plant. ## PRO-MED CAPITAL, INC.

An order has been issued extending the exemptive relief granted in a prior order (Rel. IC-13597, October 26, 1983) to a newly formed, wholly-controlled subsidiary of Pro-Med Capital, Inc. and to certain other future subsidiaries. (Rel. IC-15307 - Sept. 15)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company (C&SOE), subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to lease on an interim basis and then to sell for a total cash price of \$796,624 certain electric power distribution equipment (Facilities) to one of its industrial customers, Anheuser-Busch Inc., under a Facilities Purchase Agreement). Pending the satisfaction of certain conditions precedent to the sale and during a period specified in the Agreement, C&SOE will lease the Facilities to Busch for a monthly rental fee of \$26,500. None of the rental payments will be applied to reduce the purchase price or the cost of electric service provided to Busch. (Rel. 35-24192 - Sept. 15)

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
