RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

EXEMPTION OF LIMITED OFFERS AND SALES BY CORPORATE ISSUERS

The Commission is proposing for public comment a small issue exemptive rule, Rule 242, under Section 3(b) of the Securities Act of 1933, which would allow certain corporate issuers to offer and sell up to \$2 million per issue of their securities to an unlimited number of institutional-type purchasers and to thirty-five other purchasers providing certain conditions relating to the manner of offering, the information provided to purchasers, and the filing of notices of sale are met. All comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. 20549 on or before November 16 and should refer to File No. S7-800. All comments will be available for public inspection. (Rel. 33-6121)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

W. A. PATTERSON, INC., OTHERS CITED

The Commission has ordered the institution of public administrative proceedings against W. A. Patterson, Inc. (Patterson), a Albuquerque, New Mexico broker-dealer registered with the Commission and a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.; William A. Patterson, its president and major stockholder; Jack M. Kekich, its vice president, and Denise L. Stine, a former vice president of Patterson. The proceedings are based on allegations by the staff that the respondents wilfully violated and wilfully aided and abetted violations of the net capital, bookkeeping and supplemental reporting provisions of the securities laws and the Regulation T requirements of the Federal Reserve Board.

A hearing will be scheduled by further order to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford the respondents an opportunity to offer any defenses thereto for the purpose of determining whether any action of a remedial nature should be taken by the Commission. (Rel. 34-16165)

ERROR IN STOCK NUMBER FOR 1979 REPORT TO CONGRESS ON THE ACCOUNTING PROFESSION

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

FRANCIS X. OROFINO, OTHERS SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 7 Francis X. Orofino of New York, New York and Frank Coppa of Staten Island, New York, plead guilty to informations charging them with violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the purchase and sale of the common stock of Tucker Drilling Company, Inc.

Thereafter, on July 25, Orofino and Coppa received suspended sentences and were placed on probation for periods of three and five years respectively by the Honorable Whitman Knapp, U.S. District Court Judge for the Southern District of New York.

On February 22, in a related case, Ronald Martini plead guilty to violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the securities of Tucker. Thereafter, he received a suspended sentence and was placed on probation for a two year period, comprised of two, two year periods of probation which run concurrently. The above convictions stemmed from a related Commission injunctive action, SEC v. Orofino, et al., 76 Civil 5553 [WK], S.D.N.Y. (U.S. v. Francis X. Orofino, 79 Cr. 410, Frank Coppa, 79 Cr. 410, Ronald Martini, 79 Cr. 106). (LR-8867)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SELECTED MONEY MARKET FUND, INC.
