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NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET MARCH 5-7 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting March 5-7 in Rockville, Md., to discuss several issues of current interest. Topics include: cyber security programs for nuclear facilities, requirements for protection against pressurized thermal shock events in reactors, fatigue management for nuclear power plant personnel, and an approach for determining the technical adequacy of probabilistic risk assessment results for risk informed activities.

The ACRS advises the Commission, independently from the NRC staff, on safety issues related to the licensing and operation of nuclear power plants and in areas of health physics and radiation protection. The meeting will be held in Room T-2B3 of the agency's Two White Flint North building, at 11545 Rockville Pike. Sessions on March 5 and March 6 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., and the March 7 session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Portions of this meeting may be closed to protect national security and safeguards information.
