## NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET APR. 7-9 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting April 7-9 in Rockville, Md., to discuss several issues of current interest. Some of the topics include:

- the Safety Evaluation Report for Calvert Cliffs Unit 3 combined operating license application;
- emergency planning for small modular reactors;
- the draft final regulatory guide 1.152 on "Criteria for Use of Computers in Safety Systems of Nuclear Power Plants," and cyber security related activities;
- and human factors considerations in emerging technology for nuclear power plants.

The ACRS advises the Commission, independently from the NRC staff, on safety issues related to the licensing and operation of nuclear power plants and in areas of health physics and radiation protection.

The meeting will be held in Room T-2B1 of the agency's Two White Flint North building, at 11545 Rockville Pike. The session on April 7 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The April 8 session will run from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., and the April 9 session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Portions of the meeting may be closed to discuss proprietary information, as well as organizational and personnel matters.
