NRC ANNOUNCES AVAILABILITY OF LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION FOR LIMERICK NUCLEAR POWER PLANT UNITS 1 AND 2

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission announced today that an application for a 20-year renewal of the operating licenses for the Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2, is available for public review.

The Limerick Generating Station, Units 1 and 2, are boiling-water nuclear reactors, located in Limerick Township, Pa., about 21 miles from Philadelphia, and the current operating licenses for Units 1 and 2 expire on Oct. 26, 2024, and June 22, 2029, respectively.

The licensee, Exelon Generation Co., LLC, submitted the renewal application June 22. It is available in the NRC's electronic documents systems, known as the [Agencywide Documents Access and Management System \(ADAMS\)](#) by searching for accession number ML111790800. Help in using ADAMS can be obtained via the NRC's Public Document Room at 1-800-397-4209 or 301-415-4737, or by e-mail at PDR.Resource@nrc.gov. Documents for Limerick license renewal application will be available on the NRC website on the license renewal Web page.

The NRC staff is currently conducting an initial review of the application to determine whether it contains enough information for the required formal review. If the application has sufficient information, the NRC will formally "docket," or file, the application and will announce an opportunity to request a public hearing.
