### NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON MEDICAL USES OF ISOTOPES TELECONFERENCE MEETING DEC. 15

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's [Advisory Committee on Medical Uses of Isotopes](#) (ACMUI) will convene a teleconference meeting on Dec. 15 to discuss the ACMUI's recommendations on proposed revisions to the Abnormal Occurrence medical event criteria.

The ACMUI advises the NRC on policy and technical issues related to the regulation of medical uses of certain radioactive materials.
