## NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET DEC. 2-4 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting Dec. 2-4 in Rockville, Md., to discuss several issues of current interest. Topics include:

- Final safety evaluation report associated with the license renewal application for the Kewaunee Power Station
- ~~Draft final rule and regulatory guidance regarding enhancements to emergency preparedness regulations~~
- Final safety evaluation report associated with the amendment to the AP1000 reactor design control document
- Safety culture policy statement

The ACRS advises the Commission, independently from the NRC staff, on safety issues related to the licensing and operation of nuclear power plants as well as those issues in the areas of health physics and radiation protection.

The meeting will be held in Room T-2B1 of the agency's Two White Flint North building, at 11545 Rockville Pike. Sessions on Dec. 2 and Dec. 3 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Dec. 4 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
