
During this meeting, Greenlining presented the perspective of California's 25 million minorities regarding the pending Comcast-NBC Universal merger. Greenlining emphasized the following points:

- California's concern about Comcast's poor record of diversity, especially in its leadership and supplier diversity;
- How this merger will impact jobs in California;
- How this merger may stifle Spanish language networks, such as Telemundo, which is owned by NBC; and
- How the merger may stifle innovation in general.

Greenlining concluded this meeting by urging the FCC to conduct public hearings regarding this merger in California.
