On December 7, 2010, David L. Cohen, Executive Vice President, Matt Bond, Executive Vice President, Content Acquisition, and Kathy Zachem, Vice President, Regulatory and State Legislative Affairs, all of Comcast Corporation; Rick Cotton, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, NBC Universal, Inc.; Ron Stern, Vice President and Senior Competition Counsel, General Electric Company; Arthur Burke, Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP; David Murray, Willkie Farr & Gallagher LLP; and the undersigned (collectively, "Applicants") met with Edward Lazarus, Rick Kaplan, and Zachary Katz from the Office of the Chairman, Austin Schlick and John Flynn from the Office of General Counsel, William Lake from the Media Bureau, and Paul de Sa and Jonathan Baker from the Office of Strategic Policy and Planning.

At the meeting, Applicants discussed a number of potential conditions on the proposed transaction that are currently under consideration by the Commission and described the implications of those potential conditions on the Comcast and NBC Universal businesses. Applicants' discussion included potential conditions related to program access, program carriage, online video distribution, the provision of broadband Internet services, arbitration procedures, and set-top boxes. Although Applicants reiterated their belief that the voluntary conditions they previously offered demonstrate that the proposed transaction is strongly in the public interest and adequately address any competitive concerns that have been raised in the proceeding, Applicants also expressed their willingness to

explore additional conditions, consistent with competitive dynamics and marketplace realities, that address remaining areas of concern.
