Re: *In the Matter of Applications of Comcast Corporation, General Electric Company and NBC Universal Inc. for Consent to Assign Licenses and Transfer Control of Licenses, MB Docket No. 10-56*

Dear Ms. Dortch:

In accordance with the Memorandum Opinion and Order adopted in the above-referenced proceeding,¹ Comcast Corporation, for itself and on behalf of NBCUniversal Media, LLC, (collectively, “C-NBCU”), hereby files its second quarterly independent programming report for 2011 (attached as Exhibit A),² and its second quarterly news and information programming report for 2011 (attached as Exhibit B).³ Both reports cover programming telecast during the period beginning 12:00 a.m. local time on April 1, 2011, and continuing through 11:59 p.m. local time on June 30, 2011 (“Second Quarter 2011”).

1. The format for Exhibit A, the independent programming report, has been enhanced this quarter to provide more granular detail. A new column titled “Initial (I) or Repeat (R) Airing” identifies whether each program in the report was an initial or repeat airing. (A program is classified as a “repeat” regardless of whether the initial airing was during or prior to this quarter.) Program length and the total amount of independent programming aired by each network are now reported in hours, minutes, and seconds (HH:MM:SS)

instead of quarter-hour increments. The revised format also includes the following new or enhanced program descriptors: "Animation," "Documentary/Biography," "Court Show," "Entertainment News," "Children's," "Game Show," "Competition Show," "Lifestyle," and "Reality: Docudrama."

In total, these networks and stations aired 27,785 hours, 25 minutes and 34 seconds (27785:25:34) of independent programming during the Second Quarter 2011.

2. Exhibit B, the news and information programming report, also has been refined. For ease of use, the format for this report now mirrors the format used in the independent programming report. All news and information programming is listed sequentially on an hour-by-hour basis starting with the first program that aired within the Second Quarter 2011 reporting period, and a new "Program Description" column now specifies the genre of each news or information program included in the report.

3. By this letter, Comcast also notes the following errata to the April 11, 2011 independent programming report ("First Quarter IPR"), which were discovered during preparation of the current report: (a) The report for the CSN-New England regional sports network, which included 362 hours of independent programming, was inadvertently omitted from the First Quarter IPR. It is attached as Exhibit C. (b) The First Quarter IPR incorrectly listed nine programs, which aired for a total of 35.5 hours, as independent. The specific programs and networks affected are listed on Exhibit D.

Comcast has amended the online postings of the First Quarter IPR to reflect both errata. Once both errata are accounted for, the total number of hours of independent programming reported in the First Quarter IPR increases by 326.5 hours (from 26,663.15 hours to 26,989.65 hours).
