III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

Transformers increase or decrease voltage or change other electrical characteristics as electric energy moves from one alternating current circuit to another. These transformers are used in a home music system incorporating an FM/AM radio, a CD/MP3 CD player, and the capability to connect to portable music devices. The primary source of imports is China.

V. Technical comments

While not a continuation of a previous temporary duty suspension, two different duty suspension headings that expired on December 31, 2009 covered similar transformers that had a different size mounting bracket and a slightly different rating, and a heading in effect through 2012 covers a third transformer with different size and rating. If not under consideration for renewal, it would be helpful to amend either heading 9902.85.04 or 9902.85.06 to include the proposed characteristics and a new expiration date, rather than create yet another heading.

VI. Continuation

If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.


