A BILL

To extend temporarily the suspension of duty on Disperse Yellow 64.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DISPERSE YELLOW 64.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.03.48 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
- 6 by striking "12/31/2012" and inserting "12/31/2014".
- 7 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 8 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 9 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 10 the date of enactment of this Act.
