To suspend temporarily the duty on Disperse Yellow 184:1.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

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2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,							
3	SECTION 1. DISPERSE YELLOW 184:1.							
4	(a) In General.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of							
5	the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is							
6	amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following							
7	new heading:
