The article description was modified slightly to fit the format used in the Chapter 99 provisions and to correct the HTS subheading reference.

According to an e-mail from a National Import Specialist at U.S. Customs and Border Patrol (dated May 9, 2012), the mixture should be classified in HTS subheading 3204.11.50.

#### **VI. Continuation**

If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.

### A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on mixtures of Reactive Black 5, Benzenesulfonic acid, and 1-Naphthalenesulfonic acid.
