The subject products are subassemblies containing one or more printed circuit assemblies that are used in instruments and apparatus that measure and check electrical quantities for telecommunications. Malaysia is the leading U.S. import supplier of products classified under this subheading.

## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on subassemblies for instruments or apparatus for measuring or checking electrical quantities.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SUBASSEMBLIES FOR INSTRUMENTS OR APPA-
- 4 RATUS FOR MEASURING OR CHECKING ELEC-
- 5 TRICAL QUANTITIES.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.23.88 of the Har-
- 7 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 8 subassemblies for instruments or apparatus for measuring
- 9 or checking electrical quantities) is amended by striking

- 1 the date in the effective period column and inserting "12/
- 2 31/2015".
- 3 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 4 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 5 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 6 the date of the enactment of this Act.
