Acrylic staple fibers (polyacrylonitrile staple), dyed but not carded, combed or otherwise processed for spinning, containing by weight 92 percent or more of polyacrylonitrile, not more than 0.01 percent of zinc and 2 percent or more but not over 8 percent of water, the foregoing with a decitex of 4.0 to 6.7 (plus or minus 10 percent), with a fiber shrinkage of from 0 to 22 percent (plus or minus 10 percent), and with a cut fiber length of 100 mm to 135 mm and a target length of 120 mm (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.40.23 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 certain dyed acrylic staple fibers) is amended by striking
7 "12/31/2012" and inserting "12/31/2015".

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.
