#### II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic filament tow (polyacrylonitrile tow) containing by weight 92 percent or more of polyacrylonitrile, not more than 0.01 percent of zinc and 2 percent or more but not over 8 percent of water, imported in the form of bundles of crimped product each containing 250,000 to 350,000 filaments (plus or minus 10 percent) with an average decitex of 2.4 to 3.7 decitex (plus or minus 10 percent) and length greater than 2 meters (provided for in subheading 5501.30.00)

#### III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject product is used in the production of craft yarns. Imports are primarily from Portugal, Turkey, Thailand, Egypt, Mexico, and Spain.
