II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic staple fibers, (polyacrylonitrile staple), not carded, combed or otherwise processed for spinning, the foregoing containing by weight 92 percent or more of polyacrylonitrile, not more than 0.01 percent of zinc and 2 percent or more but not over 8 percent of water, with a decitex of 2.4 to 3.7 (plus or minus 10 percent), a fiber shrinkage of 0 to 22 percent (plus or minus 10 percent), and with a cut fiber length of 89 mm to 140 mm, and a target length of 115 mm (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

The subject product is used in the production of craft yarns. U.S. imports are primarily from Portugal, Turkey, Thailand, Egypt, Mexico, and Spain.
