# II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Cyan 854 inkjet printing ink: Copper phthalocyanine substituted with sulphonic acids and alkyl sulphonoamides, sodium/ ammonium salts (PMN No. P02-893) (provided for in subheading 3215.19.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

#### III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The product is printing ink that is put into cartridges for ink-jet printers. It is imported from the United Kingdom.

The Commission staff notes the proposed heading does not contain a CAS number. The interested entity has asserted that the inclusion of a CAS number would reveal confidential information about the firm's production processes. The interested entity has provided an EPA Pre-Manufacture Notice Number (PMN No.) but has not supplied a copy of the document to the staff. This makes it difficult to determine the intended scope of the bill, to confirm whether the subject products are described and classified correctly and to avoid limiting tariff relief to one firm's brand name.
