III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

An ultraviolet (UV) lamp filled with deuterium gas is a light source used in UV detectors for commercially available liquid chromatographs and spectrophotometers. A deuterium lamp emits a stable and almost continuous UV spectrum of light making it ideal for high precision absorption measurement. The largest sources of U.S. imports are Germany and Japan. There is a smaller volume of imports from the United Kingdom, Singapore, France, Switzerland, and Israel.

V. Technical comments

None. Although the section title set forth in the bill specifies that the subject lamps would be used for particular purposes, that use criterion was omitted from the article description and would require Customs verification within three years of the date of each entry. Because of this burden on importers and Customs alike, we did not suggest adding a "use requirement" to the article description of the proposed heading. Doing so might reduce the revenue loss shown herein.
