## A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on trifloxysulfuron-sodium.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. TRIFLOXYSULFURON-SODIUM.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.13.32 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 N-[[(4,6-Dimethoxy-2-pyrimidinyl)amino]carbonyl]-3-
- 7 (2,2,2-trifluoroethoxy)-2-pyridinesulfonamide monosodium
- 8 salt (trifloxysulfuron-sodium)) is amended by striking the
- 9 date in the effective period column and inserting "12/31/
- 10 2015".
- 11 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 12 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
