III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

These products are used primarily to hold prescriptive and protective lenses in eyeglasses and goggles. Plastic frames are durable, can accommodate most lens prescriptions, and are available in a variety of plastics (including acrylic, epoxy, cellulose acetate, cellulose propionate, polyamide, and nylon), colors, and shapes. China, Italy, Japan, and France are the primary sources of U.S. imports of plastic frames and mountings.

We suggest deleting the comma after "goggles" to be consistent with normal HTS usage, which omits the comma after the penultimate item in a series.

VI. Continuation

The estimated customs revenue loss is based on a temporary reduction of the general rate of duty from 2.5 percent ad valorem to 2.4 percent, a reduction of 0.1 percentage point.
