II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic staple fibers (polyacrylonitrile staple) containing 85 percent or more by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not over 3 percent of water, nonpigmented (ecru), crimped, with an average decitex of 2.2 (plus or minus 10 percent), and fiber length of 50 mm (plus or minus 10 percent) (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain acrylic staple fibers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN ACRYLIC STAPLE FIBERS.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.16 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 certain acrylic staple fibers) is amended by striking the
- 7 date in the effective period column and inserting "12/31/
- 8 2015".
- 9 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 10 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
