II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic staple fibers (polyacrylonitrile staple) containing 85 percent or more by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not over 3 percent of water, colored, crimped, with an average decitex of 2.2 (plus or minus 10 percent) and fiber length of 45 mm (plus or minus 10 percent) and fiber tenacity of 0.4 N/tex (plus or minus 10 percent) (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

This bill is not a duty reduction

This bill is a temporary duty reduction. Rates are shown below.

Duty reduction notes:

We note that the enactment of this bill and H.R. 4447, H.R. 4448, H.R. 4451, and H.R. 4453, or any combination thereof, would result in overlapping product coverage. This overlapping scope makes it impossible to estimate with any certainty the volume of imports or customs revenue lost under each bill. Section IV of this report estimates the value of dutiable imports and customs revenue lost per year should only this bill pass. The estimates do not contemplate the effect of overlapping product coverage.

The article descriptions for the proposed heading under this bill contain overlapping fiber tenacity criterion with the proposed new heading under H.R. 4451 and, apart from the added fiber tenacity criterion, the same criteria as existing heading 9902.40.10 (which would be renewed under H.R. 4447). Additionally, the proposed heading in this bill overlaps with fiber length criterion in H.R. 4448 and the tenacity criterion of H.R. 4453.
