## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on formulations containing Bromacil and Diuron and application adjuvants.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FORMULATIONS CONTAINING BROMACIL AND
- 4 DIURON AND APPLICATION ADJUVANTS.
- 5 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.13.27 of the Har-
- 6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 7 formulations containing Bromacil and Diuron and applica-
- 8 tion adjuvants) is amended by striking the date in the ef-
- 9 fective period column and inserting "12/31/2015".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.
