A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 2-Chloro-6-Fluorobenzyl Chloride.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. 2-CHLORO-6-FLUOROBENZYL CHLORIDE.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.70 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 2-Chloro-6-Fluorobenzyl Chloride) is amended by striking
- 7 "12/31/2012" and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
