A BILL

To extend the temporary reduction of duty on yarn of carded camel hair.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. YARN OF CARDED CAMEL HAIR.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.86 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 yarn of carded camel hair) is amended by striking the date
- 7 in the effective period column and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
