II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Modacrylic staple fibers containing 35 percent or more but not over 85 percent by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not over 3 percent of water, not pigmented (ecru), crimped, with an average decitex of 1.9 (plus or minus 10 percent) and fiber length of 51 mm (plus or minus 10 percent) (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain modacrylic staple fibers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN MODACRYLIC STAPLE FIBERS.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.05 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 certain modacrylic staple fibers) is amended by striking
- 7 "12/31/2012" and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
