### II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic staple fibers containing at least 85 percent by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not more than 3 percent of water, not dyed or pigmented (ecru), crimped, with an average decitex of 1.9 (plus or minus 10 percent) and fiber length of 51 mm (plus or minus 10 percent) (provided for in subheading 5503.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain acrylic staple fibers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN ACRYLIC STAPLE FIBERS.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.06 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 certain acrylic staple fibers) is amended by striking "12/
- 7 31/2012" and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.
