II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic filament tow containing 85 percent or more by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not over 3 percent of water, raw white (undyed), crimped, with an average decitex of 3.3 (plus or minus 10 percent) and an aggregate filament measure in the tow bundle from 660,000 to 1,200,000 decitex, with a length greater than 2 meters (provided for in subheading 5501.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

V. Technical comments

The article description set forth above changed the word "fiber" to "filament" to match the wording of the permanent HTS provision referenced. Also, the revised language changed the phrase "between 660,000 and 1,200,000 decitex" to "from 660,000 to 1,200,000 decitex" for consistency with similar chapter 99 provisions and to reflect the intent described by the interested entity.

VI. Continuation

Criteria specified in the article description of HTS heading 9902.40.14 overlap those specified in heading 9902.10.21 and are close to or overlapping with those of several other temporary HTS headings (taking into account specified variances), making an accurate estimate of future imports under each such heading difficult.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain acrylic fiber tow.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN ACRYLIC FIBER TOW.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.14 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 certain acrylic fiber tow) is amended by striking "12/31/
- 7 2012" and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 9 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
