## II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Acrylic filament tow containing 85 percent or more by weight of acrylonitrile units and 2 percent or more but not over 3 percent of water, colored, crimped, with an average decitex of 3.3 (plus or minus 10 percent) and an aggregate filament measure in the tow bundle from 660,000 to 1,200,000 decitex, with a length greater than 2 meters (provided for in subheading 5501.30.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

The subject tow is used to make craft yarns, and yarns for blankets and hosiery. Imports are primarily from Turkey and Spain.

## **V. Technical comments**

The article description set forth above changed the requirement that the product be "between 660,000 and 1,200,000 decitex" to "from 660,000 to 1,200,000 decitex" to achieve consistency with similar chapter 99 provisions and to reflect the intent described by the interested entity.

Criteria specified in the proposed article description of the new HTS heading overlap those specified in heading 9902.10.21 and are close to or overlapping with those of several other temporary HTS headings (taking into account specified variances), making an accurate estimate of future imports under each such heading difficult.
