II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Plaiting materials and products of plaiting materials, suitable for use in window shades, presented in rolls each having an area measuring over 27.85 m2 but less than 46.46 m2, of any combination of wood slats each measuring 6 mm or more but not over 8 mm in width or 22 mm or more but not over 25 mm in width and measuring 1 mm or more but not over 2 mm in thickness, bamboo reeds measuring 1 mm or more but not over 2.5 mm in width, marupa wood rods measuring 1.5 mm or more but not over 3 mm in diameter and/or paper rope, the foregoing woven with polyester yarn into a repeating pattern which may also include jute, polyester yarn or paper (provided for in subheading 4601.94.20)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

This product is window shade material composed principally of horizontal wood slats and/or marupa rods (Simarouba spp., a light-colored wood grown in South and Central America and the Caribbean) that are woven together using polyester yarn and imported in rolls of the specified sizes. The material may also include bamboo stems and/or rope made of twisted paper to form a decorative pattern, but the essential character of the article is provided by the wood materials. The subject article must be made of "plaiting materials" as defined in chapter 46, note 1, in order to be classified in heading 4601. The material may be unfinished or finished using stain, paint or lacquer. The imported rolled material is then cut to desired widths and lengths to be manufactured into window shades sold as "woven natural fiber" shade styles. Manufacturing consists of cutting the rolls to specified sizes and adding the necessary hardware such as head and bottom rails, pulleys or other mechanical fittings and a lift cord.

There are no known domestic manufacturers of window shade material made of wood plaiting materials. The fabrication of these materials is labor intensive, so they are produced in countries with low labor costs. They are mainly imported from China, Taiwan, Indonesia and Vietnam. Window shades are sold through specialty retailers, specialty mail order vendors, custom home furnishing dealers and general merchandise retailers.

We oppose the bill as written because even though we import these materials we would be excluded from benefiting from the temporary suspension of duties because of technicalities, including the size of the rolls being imported and the dimensions of some of the components used to weave the rolls.

The bill as written would benefit one company in our industry to the exclusion of other such as us.

Below is the wording of the bill with suggested changes that would benefit everyone in the industry, rather than one company. The areas we would suggest removing are lined out with the suggested replacement wording in yellow.
