II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Portable gas grill and cooler combinations, each having a collapsible base, utilizing infrared cooking technology consisting of an infrared re-emitter plate positioned between the heat source and food support grate, the plate and grate each having a surface area of approximately 1,871 cm² (provided for in subheading 7321.11.10).

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

According to the proponent's Internet website, its grills use technology that relies on infrared heating, generated by a gas-fired burner that heats a patented infrared-radiating burner plate, to minimize the drying of cooked food that occurs with conventional hot-air convection cooking. China is the major source for U.S. imports of this product.

A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain portable infrared gas grill and cooler combinations.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN PORTABLE INFRARED GAS GRILL**

4 **AND COOLER COMBINATIONS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:
