Portable gas grills, each having a base mounted on wheels or casters, such grills utilizing infrared cooking technology consisting of an infrared re-emitter plate positioned between the heat source and food support grate, the plate and grate having a surface area of approximately 2,064 cm2 (provided for in subheading 7321.11.10).

According to the proponent's Internet website, its grills use technology that relies on infrared heating, generated by a gasfired burner that heats a patented infrared-radiating burner plate, to minimize the drying of cooked food that occurs with conventional hot-air convection cooking. China is the major source for U.S. imports of this product.
