Eyelash curlers are tools that curl eyelashes for the purpose of cosmetic enhancement. They are made with various types of finger mechanisms to operate the tool. The metal tip that touches the eyelashes may be coated with rubber. U.S. imports of all types of nonthermic, nonornamental devices for curling the hair under HTS subheading 9615.90.20 in 2011 amounted to \$21.5 million, with China accounting for 81 percent of the total and Japan accounting for, 10 percent.
