Mr. Gene Green of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To extend and modify the temporary suspension of duty on Propiconazole.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. PROPICONAZOLE.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.80 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to Propiconazole) is amended—

(1) by striking "Free" and inserting "5.2%";

and

(2) by striking the date in the effective period

column and inserting "12/31/2015".

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- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 2 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or
- 3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

4 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
