## A BILL

To extend and modify the reduction of duty on Mandipropamid.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. MANDIPROPAMID.
4	(a) In General.—Heading 9902.12.07 of the Har-
5	monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6	Mandipropamid) is amended—
7	(1) by striking " $1.2\%$ " and inserting " $1.4\%$ ";
8	and
9	(2) by striking the date in the effective period

- 3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
