A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Pymetrozine.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PYMETROZINE.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.13.30 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 Pymetrozine) is amended by striking the date in the effec-
- 7 tive period column and inserting "12/31/2015".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
