## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on magnesium hydroxide with a purity greater than or equal to 99.8 percent.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MAGNESIUM HYDROXIDE WITH A PURITY
- 4 GREATER THAN OR EQUAL TO 99.8 PERCENT.
- 5 (a) In General.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
- 6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
- 7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
- 8 new heading:
