## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on Lucirin TPO.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-								
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,								
3	SECTION 1. LUCIRIN TPO.								
4	(a) In General.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of								
5	the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is								
6	amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following								
7	new heading:								
	" 9902.01.00 Diphenyl(2,4,6-trimethylbenzoyl)phosphine oxide (CAS No. 75980–60–8) (provided for in subheading 2926.90.30) Free No change No change On or before $12/31/2015$ ".								

- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
