## A BILL

To extend and modify the temporary reduction of duty on 3,3'-Dichlorobenzidine dihydrochloride ([1,1'-biphenyl]-4,4'-diamino, 3,3'-dichloro-).

- 3 SECTION 1. 3,3'-DICHLOROBENZIDINE DIHYDROCHLORIDE
- 4 ([1,1'-BIPHENYL]- 4,4'-DIAMINO, 3,3'-DICHLORO-
- 5).
- 6 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.25.73 of the Har-
- 7 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 8 3,3'-Dichlorobenzidine dihydrochloride ([1,1'-biphenyl]-
- 9 4,4'-diamino, 3,3'-dichloro-)) is amended—

1	(1) by striking " $5.9\%$ " and inserting " $3.8\%$ ";

3	(2) by striking the date in the effective period
4	column and inserting "12/31/2015".
5	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
6	subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
7	warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
