A BILL

To extend and modify the temporary suspension of duty on 2-Cyanopyridine.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. 2-CYANOPYRIDINE.
4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.22.35 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 2-Cyanopyridine) is amended—
7 (1) by striking "3.2%" and inserting "3.4%";
8 and
9 (2) by striking the date in the effective period

column and inserting "12/31/2015".

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- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 2 subsection (a) apply to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
