III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are snap-fasteners, a type of closure device commonly used on apparel, luggage, handbags, and purses. Most snap-fasteners are made of metal, but they are not primarily magnetic. Magnetic snaps are typically used in the manufacture of leather goods. Italy, China, Japan, and Mexico are the leading suppliers of snap-fasteners. However, because China produces most of the world supply of the rare earth metals needed to make magnetic snap-fasteners, most magnetic snap-fasteners are imported from China.
